Job Summary:

Supports the Fine and Performing Arts department in day to day activities as well as performances that take place throughout the school.

Key Responsibilities:

- Programming, setting up and running technical setups for all types of school events e.g. plays, concerts, assemblies, meetings.
- Trains, supervises and assists staff, students and custodians during setup and strike of activities in the performance venues.
- Plans and leads technical tutorials for students and faculty when needed.
- Assisting and coordinating in the planning, designing, constructing, and running technical set-up during school performances when students and staff are part of running an event.
- Assists faculty and students with set design, props, costume and other theater-related areas.
- Assists in the organization and maintenance of areas such as the lighting booth, lighting storage areas, FAT backstage and all other theater areas as needed.

- Prepares, updates and maintains equipment inventories and venue maintenance records for the backstage area.
